

Reaching out with the Good News

The primary purpose of the church is to be a witness to Jesus Christ and to help others find him – Jesus commissioned his first disciples to go and make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:18-20).

Today we must not lose sight of that essential part of our life and work - sharing the Good News with others so that they too might find new life in Christ and eternal salvation. **HOPE Together** has a vision to use Easter 2024 as a major period of outreach in the UK and I'm sure we'd want to jump at that opportunity to share in things. They are releasing a new short course entitled **Alive** looking at five resurrection appearances of Jesus to help people explore the astonishing truth that Jesus came back from the dead.

The Talking Jesus research in 2022 showed that 45% of the UK population believe that Jesus rose from the dead! 16% are totally convinced but a further 29% believe but have some uncertainties about this. Easter is a great opportunity to reach that 29% and help them fully realise the transforming power of the resurrection of Jesus now and for eternity!

We need not wait till then, of course. This new term presents us with many opportunities to explore faith – our Encounter Harvest special, Messy church and regular meeting points like The Well and CatURpillars give us great chances to talk about why we do church.

One resource that has been such a blessing to us for nearly 30 years is **The Alpha Course**. We have used it many times over this period and it has brought much fruit as lots of people have been helped in getting to know Jesus and making a start on the path of discipleship – it is just a beginning, hence the name.

Do please pray about this – maybe it's for you to find out more about what it means to follow Jesus - or for a friend or neighbour who has

questions. Consider who you might invite along – you are welcome to come with them.





- On Saturday 30th September we will hold a Messy Harvest event led by Yvonne and the team. Please speak to Yvonne or Brian if you can help out.

Harvest Appeal

Church Meeting also decided that our harvest appeal should be in support of a locally based “family” project and Rod & Ann Foster undertook to look into the Mother and Baby Facility housed in the Lodge at the Winchester House YMCA building. Here is a summary of their detailed report (*huge thanks to Rod & Ann*):-

This project, which began in 2014, seeks to support mothers between the ages of 16 to 25 (and their babies) who are either classified as homeless, those who cannot live with their families or those where their homes are in crisis ~ they are usually referred by the Council. Those who are placed there are helped to take responsibility for their own welfare and to learn ‘life skills’ which will aid them in the future. By its very nature, this is a protected environment for the occupants and therefore security and confidentiality are paramount.

- The ongoing needs of the facility fall into 4 main categories:
- Financial donations to help them maintain and improve the facility
- Mother & Baby Items (especially disposable nappies, sizes 3-6)
- Household Items for the accommodation (ranging from tea towels to fridges & freezers, please ask Rod & Ann for more details)
- Volunteers to help out (especially in the areas of Life Skills training; Arts and Crafts; Cooking; Home Maintenance etc.)

On behalf of the Elders, in the weeks before and after our own Harvest Celebration, envelopes will be provided for cash donations to this Harvest Appeal, which will be passed onto the organisers of the project.

If you would like to know more about the work of the Mother and Baby Facility or would like to donate any new and second-hand items which might be of use to them, please speak to Rod & Ann Foster.

If you have some spare time, why not consider volunteering with them?

As usual, during our service on Sunday 24th, we will be collecting food and non-perishable gifts for the IoW Foodbank to help support those on the Island who have been hit hardest by the cost-of-living crisis. Look out for details of the items most needed this month.



Harvest Supper on Friday 22nd September @ 18:00

Sue W will put up a sign-up sheet during September and will coordinate our food order from the Paramount Café, which will be delivered to the church. This will consist of four choices (with prices) including a vegetarian option. Unfortunately, Paramount cannot provide a gluten-free option but please do come and join in with us and 'bring your own'. Please look out for further details. The 'ticket price' will cover the cost of the food and refreshments will be provided.

We hope to see as many faces as possible so do consider inviting a friend along. If cost is an issue, please still sign up to come and speak to Brian who will make the necessary arrangements.

All monies will be collected on the evening ~ please hand these to Sue, thanks.

It would be good to have some "cakes" after the meal ~ if you can provide some of these please speak to Sue.

This is very much a social time so we may plan a welcome activity and could perhaps have a few items of home-spun entertainment to round things off. Please speak to Brian if you have ideas or offers for that.

Ministry And Mission Fund - Annual Letter To Local Churches

To: All members and adherents of United Reformed Churches and our Local Ecumenical Partnerships

Dear Friends,

When will normal service be resumed?

As we are writing this letter and closing off the URC's accounts for 2022, the country is still torn with industrial disputes, mostly notably with Health Service workers, rail industry workers, teachers etc. etc. Whatever your view as to the wisdom or justice of such action, we suspect all of us are affected by the disruption to some degree.

In church life too, are we back to "normal life"? Some churches no doubt have returned to something like their pre-Covid level of activity and attendance numbers. Quite a few have recommenced their activity but find their numbers have reduced. Some churches have found re-opening too difficult and have decided to close.

Whatever the "new normal" was to be, we suggest its arrival has (like many trains) been disrupted, delayed, or cancelled all together.

The URC's finance officers had concerns that the late arrival of the return to normality would impact very significantly on the giving to the M&M Fund in 2022. However, the churches responded magnificently and the giving to M&M was £600,000 ahead of budget. It was also only 2.5% down on 2021's result.



So, thank you to all who continued to contribute to your local church, thank you to all those churches who met their commitment for 2022 in full, and thank you to all those who, in adversity, continued to treat the M&M Fund as the first priority and paid what they could.

With normal service not yet resumed, 2023 is not going to be an easy year either. We now have the added disruption of high inflation, pushing up wages and overhead costs. As the Spirit directs and as our means allow, can the churches once more respond to the call of our gracious, loving and ever-generous God?





True Fulfilment

Neil looks at how Christians can achieve the true fulfilment God wants for their lives:

Using Your Unique Gifts and Abilities

**“Keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.”
(2 Timothy 4:5)**

For the Christian, true fulfilment in life can be summarized by the popular bumper sticker slogan, "Bloom where you're planted." Peter put it this way:

“Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God’s grace in its various forms.” (1 Peter 4:10)

Your greatest fulfilment in life will come when you discover your unique gifts and abilities and use them to edify others and glorify the Lord.

God allowed me to understand this vital principle before entering the ministry while I was still employed as an aerospace engineer. I knew God wanted me to be an ambassador for Him where I worked, so I started a breakfast Bible study in the bowling alley next door. My announcement about the Bible study had only been posted in our office about an hour before a Jewish fellow pulled it off the wall and brought it to me. "You can't bring Jesus in here," he objected. "I can't do otherwise," I said. "Every day I walk in here Jesus comes in with me." He was not impressed with my response!

One of the men who found Christ in the Bible study took over when I left Honeywell to enter seminary. A few months later I went back to

visit my friends in the Bible study. "Do you remember the Jewish fellow?" the leader asked. "Sure, I remember him," I said, recalling his brash opposition to our Bible study. "Well, he got sick and almost died. I went to the hospital and visited him every night. Finally I led him to Christ."

I was ecstatic at the realisation that I had become a spiritual grandparent. The sense of fulfilment was exhilarating. And it all happened because I started a simple little Bible study where I worked in order to do what Paul told Timothy to do (see above)!

Father, I want to bloom where I am planted and resist the defeating temptation to compare myself to others.

Fulfilling Your Unique Role

“We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ’s behalf: be reconciled to God.” (2 Corinthians 5:20)

God has a unique place of ministry for each of us. It is important to your sense of fulfilment that you realize exactly where that place is.

The key is to discover the roles you occupy in which you cannot be replaced, and then decide to be what God wants you to be in those roles. For example, of the billions of people in the world, you are the only one who occupies your unique role as husband, father, wife, mother, parent, or child in your home. God has specially planted you to serve Him by serving your family and the community where you live.

Assuming the responsibility of our primary roles is too challenging for some, but it is the only path of fulfilment. You will never be fulfilled trying to become something you're not. You occupy a unique role as an ambassador for Christ where you work and live. These are your mission fields and you are the worker God has appointed for the harvest there. Your greatest fulfilment will come from accepting and occupying God's unique place for you to the best of your ability. Sadly, so many miss their calling in life by looking for fulfilment in the world.

Find your fulfilment in the kingdom of God by deciding to be an

ambassador for Christ in the world ~ as Paul said:

**“Keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.”
(2 Timothy 4:5)**

A **new publication** from **Elam Ministries**, '**Iran and Beyond**', which shares about how Iran's Church is growing and how in this season of suffering, as the government continues to oppress its' people, Iranians are more open than ever to hearing about the God who conquers through suffering: '**Jesus, the lion who is the lamb who was slain.**' The one who loves them and laid His life for them. **Do take a copy** and be blessed and encouraged in the testimonies of those who have encountered Jesus.

And do please pray for our brothers and sisters in prison in Iran for their faith and their families for whom life can be very difficult.

Other new resources to take a copy and pray through are the **Sept/Oct Open Doors magazine and prayer diary.**

All of the above will be available in the Church or the entrance lobby.

Also do please continue to pray for the Church and believers in **Nigeria.**

There is continuing violence targeted against Christian communities there, which has led to mass killings of our brothers and sisters in Christ from terrorists and extremists.

“Every indication suggests Nigeria is at a pivotal point in its history,” says Release International's partner in that country. Terror groups Boko Haram and Islamic State West Africa continue to defy the authorities, and Fulani militants attack Christian villages with impunity. In 2022, reports indicate Fulani militants ***killed more than 6,000 Christians and destroyed 17 villages.***

*The violence has driven more than **two million people from their homes.** Along with that has come increasing lawlessness. “Kidnapping for ransom has now become the major money earner for terrorist groups, while the numbers of victims of rape and people living with disabilities due to attacks continue to grow among the Christian communities,”* says Release International's partner. *“Hundreds of thousands of children in these Christian villages are unable to go to school or access good education.”*

Precious Life Giving Water

How blessed we are to have clean running water in our homes and although there are issues with our rivers and seas at times, we can feel assured that when we turn on our taps, what comes out will be good for us.

Not so in many parts of the world. **Samaritan's Purse** ministers in many countries where the need for clean, germ free water is paramount.

Dr Franklin Graham shares in his recent update of such a situation in **Cambodia** as follows:

Lessons in Living Water – sharing Jesus through safe water in Cambodia

Dear Friend,

In the last pages of the Bible, the Lord reveals the New Jerusalem, flowing with “a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding from the throne of God and of the Lamb” (Revelation 22:1).

But the concept of pure water can be hard to grasp in Cambodian villages where generations of children have grown up drinking out of stagnant ponds or mildewed rain barrels, and waterborne diseases are a fact of life.

Cambodia is just one of many places around the world where Samaritan's Purse is working to provide safe drinking water—not only to promote public health but also to help illustrate the deeper truths of Jesus Christ:

“He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water” (John 7:38).

I hope you will be encouraged by reading the stories of several students whose lives and futures have been transformed through our safe water projects in Cambodia. Samaritan's Purse has provided filters and latrines at these village schools, and teachers now share lessons about the vitality of clean water, sanitation, and hygiene.*

As waterborne diseases have become less of a threat, student

attendance has improved, and the Lord has opened doors for our teams to explain to hundreds of children how much Christ loves them, and how they can have a relationship with Him.

We are working in a province that was one of the last holdouts of the Khmer Rouge regime, in villages that do not yet have churches. Yet many of these children are reading their Bibles and discovering the power of prayer.

“Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God” (Matthew 5:8).

On behalf of these children and other around the world in great need, thank you for supporting the work of Samaritan’s Purse through your gifts and prayers.

Riches Beyond Measure!

How many different translations of the Bible might we have on our shelves – hopefully not gathering dust, but being well used?

For countless people groups in the world, they have not yet had these riches that we have of owning any part of Scripture. **Bible Society** has had a bold vision since 2018, to complete **1,200 Scripture translations by 2038**.

In **2022**, despite worldwide upheavals, many dear people were blessed with God's precious Word. The following article from Bible Society gives the exciting news!

Scripture translations for 723 million people completed last year – Thank You!

22 June 2023

Bible Society teams around the world completed Scripture translations in 81 languages used by 723 million people in 2022, despite global disruptions caused by Covid, economic instability and the war in Ukraine.

This was achieved thanks to the kind giving of Bible Society supporters. Thank you!

From Brazil to Bangladesh, 57 language groups – a total of 100 million people – received first Scripture translations. This included 14 first full Bible translations.

Five million Ethiopians, who speak Arsi Oromo, and 6,000 Indonesians on the island of Tagulandang who speak Sangirese, are just two examples of communities who can now access the Bible in their heart language.

New or revised translations were completed in another 25 languages used by more than 623 million people. These are crucial as languages change over time and Scripture translations can become outdated and hard to understand, particularly for younger generations.

Last year, Bible Society teams also completed Scripture portions in 20 sign languages.

As of the start of 2023, the full Bible is available in 733 languages spoken by 5.9 billion people. Over 70 per cent of these were translated by Bible Society teams.

About 5.9 billion people now have the full Bible in their own language. But that leaves more than 1.5 billion without the full Bible in their heart languages. And 51 per cent of the world's languages, most of them spoken by smallish groups of people, still have no Scripture at all.

With your support, Bible Society teams aim to make the Scriptures available in every language so that every single person in the world can more easily engage with the word of God.

Since 2018, Bible Society teams worldwide have been focused on a bold vision – to complete 1,200 Scripture translations by 2038. So far, thanks to the kind giving of Bible Society supporters, 133 translations have been completed and 333 are in progress.

Ryde URC - An Eco-Church?

What, you might ask, is an Eco-Church? The Eco Church movement is an organisation dedicated to getting Christians and Christian churches and denominations to recognise that we have a special, one could say God given duty, to look after the environment and to protect the world that God created. Not only to protect the environment but to go further and provide leadership to all people and be a driving force in environmental protection and restoration locally, nationally and globally. In particular those churches that 'sign up' to being Eco-Churches are set the challenge of meeting a set of standards, Bronze, Silver and Gold, in various aspects of their environmental stewardship and leadership.

Why should we as Christians be putting our effort into 'saving the planet', should we not be 'saving souls'? Yes of course we should be seeking to save souls and our primary focus should be on the kingdom of God, not the kingdoms of this world but, theologically, looking after this world, which is, after all, God's creation and gift to us, is also part of our Christian duty.

Firstly it is a duty to God. If you are given a beautiful and valuable gift by someone it is hardly a sign of gratitude to treat it disrespectfully, trash it thoughtlessly and act as if it has no great value. So what does it say about our respect for God if we treat the world that He created, and declared as good (1), as if it can be destroyed without thought or consequence. If we truly love God then we must love what he has created and gifted to us and so cherish and protect it.

Secondly as St. James wrote in his letter to the churches (2), simply meeting someone's spiritual needs when they are suffering physical needs is not enough, we must first meet their physical needs then we can truly meet their spiritual needs.

Finally We are told that we must look after our own bodies because they are the temple in which the Holy Spirit has its dwelling and, if we destroy the environment, which is where our bodies have their dwelling, we are damaging those bodies just as surely as if we were

taking a slow poison. Indeed in polluting and destroying the delicate balance that sustains life on this planet we are surely slowly poisoning ourselves as well.

So just what are the issues that Eco-Church is seeking to address? No doubt we are all aware of the current Global warming/climate change issues and its relationship to so called greenhouse gas emissions: the rapid changes to the climate, rising sea levels, increasing frequency of severe weather events and wild fires. But perhaps less well known is the danger posed by the mass extinctions that are underway not just of large charismatic plants and animals but of more mundane but no less important species. For instance there has been a massive decline in some species of insects and other invertebrates. That decline in turn threatens global food supplies which rely on those invertebrates either as foundations of food chains or as providers of vital services such as pollination or waste disposal.

Whilst some of these extinctions can be laid at the door of global warming many others are caused more directly by habitat destruction, over use of pesticides or other destructive farming practices. Other global issues, also exacerbated in part by global warming to be sure but also by greed and ignorance, are loss of habitat, loss of fertile farm land and of available fresh water. Without major changes in land and water use practices very many more people will die in the next 50 years of drought and famine.

Even here in the United Kingdom, degradation of farm land is already affecting food production and causing other environmental issues. Whilst over extraction from aquifers and pollution is destroying what were once thriving river systems. Air pollution is not restricted to greenhouse gases either, we pump waste gases into our atmosphere at ever increasing rates without thinking of the consequences. We may have dodged a bullet with CFCs causing a hole in the ozone layer but other pollutants are causing harm, from nitrous oxides from diesel and other exhausts which contribute to breathing difficulties that cause lung damage and soot particles that increase the melting of the ice caps and glaciers. Not only do we have environmental problems with land, water and air pollution but our inappropriate use of artificial light causes environmental issues

for many nocturnal plants and animals as well as hiding the glory of the night sky from many town dwellers.

Make no mistake the environmental issues facing all of us are urgent, great and serious. But all is not lost: we can 'do something about it'. Just as we are all in part responsible for the problem we can all do something to help fix it. I on my own cannot reverse global warming or stop global plastic pollution but collectively we can act to reduce our contribution to the problems, we can seek to persuade others to join us in doing so and in applying pressure on the politicians, leaders of commerce and industry and world leaders to implement solutions to these issues. Which is where Eco-Church comes in.

As an Eco-Church we are making a public statement that we are trying to 'do our bit', that rather than give up we are going to make what changes we can not just as a church but as individual members of the church. We are not ignoring the problems but rather are trying to find out what we can do and where possible doing it. This will entail thinking about what we can do, praying for guidance and wisdom, stepping out in faith and making our selves heard by those who can act on our behalf: locally, nationally and globally. Our voice will be magnified by working with others in other churches and faiths as well as secular organisations that share our concern for God's wonderful creation and gift. Our aspiration as a church should not just to achieve bronze, then silver and gold awards but to make a difference to peoples lives and life attitudes so that we can all look at the way we look after the gifts God has given us and be satisfied that we are demonstrating our gratitude for those gifts.

So what are the challenges we face and how do we turn them into opportunities? We are a small congregation and do not have a strong financial position so cannot, at present, make expensive changes, indeed any costs we incur must be carefully and prayerfully thought through. but this is in itself an opportunity, firstly it means we cannot rush wilily-nilly into throwing money at the problem bust must like others seek to find the best answers and seek sources of help. It also gives us the opportunity to ask others both inside the church and outside to contribute and, thus, buy into our environmental activities Fancy sponsoring a bug hotel any one? We are in the main an elderly congregation which limits our ability to carry out some

physical labour but this to can be an opportunity to get others involved whether it be in planting wild life friendly plants or constructing, putting up bird boxes or even perhaps digging a small wild life pond. We have limited knowledge about what is the best way forward to meet our Eco-Church goals but this gives us the opportunity use our premises to hold open meetings and information sessions with local council members or candidates and ecologically minded organisations thereby bringing local people into the church and raising our profile as an Eco-Church. We are weak in a society driven by strong forces, but this gives us the opportunity to step out in faith and to let the Holy Spirit demonstrate her power for it is God's creation and, if we go forth in faith, He will prosper our work. And we will be worthy stewards of His world, a world that He pronounced as good so in His name let us work to restore it to that status.





Fines, fun and forgiveness – the setbacks and celebrations of summer camps in Central Asia

Have you been at a camp or festival this summer, or getting ready to attend one? For many of us, they're a regular feature of our calendars. It's the same for believers worldwide, but in many places like Central Asia, they happen against the backdrop of persecution...

Camps and festivals are well underway here in the UK, but in many places worldwide, holding summer events can be dangerous – as one camp in Central Asia discovered a few weeks ago.

It was held by a registered church, but due to restrictions around summer camps, the secret police closed it because the gospel was being preached (in some Central Asian countries, it's illegal to evangelise to under 18s). The pastor was imprisoned for a week, during which time he endured several rounds of interrogation. He and his church have since each been fined the equivalent of around £450.

But there is good news elsewhere, because a summer camp for men who come from a Muslim-majority region that can be hostile to Christianity did go ahead safely – and to huge success.

Most of those who attended the event are believers, with others going to discover more about Christianity. The programme featured games, activities and extended meals, and talks on a variety of topics, including forgiveness – and it's here that one young person was particularly impacted.

Yousef* grew up hating his father, who beat him and sexually abused his sister when they were younger. He had recently been told that his father didn't want to see him anymore. On arriving at the event, Yousef had been making plans for revenge, but after hearing about forgiveness, he decided to let go of his bitterness and forgive him. "That was a powerful moment," shares a local partner.

A travelling miracle

It's not the only encouraging news. We regularly ask you to pray for summer camps in Central Asia, given the dangers, and when local partners involved in the camps heard about this, they wanted to let you know the difference your prayers make.

"Dear brothers and sisters, thank you very much for your prayers," said a partner. "We greatly appreciate your support and help with prayers and means and care. We feel your love and care and thank you and praise the Lord and God the Father for your obedience."

"We really feel your prayers for the camps which we are organising," said another partner. "Just yesterday, we had problem with tickets to travel, and today God already provided tickets for His children! It was really a miracle for all of us!"

I give up, I will just sink beneath the waves. I crest one more wave, preparing for my fate.

I see a figure coming towards me He is walking on the water, I rub my eyes in disbelief. It's true He is there walking on the water, He reaches out a hand and simply says 'take my hand I will save you'

I know I am truly saved.

There are many denominations.

Sequel to the testimony I shared in the August 'The Link'

(with apologies to those who have already heard my story)

2009 was a devastating year for me. In April that year I went through the hardest thing I had ever faced in my life – and later in that same year, I received yet another shattering blow. It wasn't long after that when I started having extreme headaches off and on, behind my right eye. They were particularly noticeable because I had never been susceptible to headaches. They increased in intensity whenever I straightened up after bending down – and also when driving over bumps.

I went for a CT scan in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, in November 2009, but before I had the result, the Lord spoke to me about forgiving. So, I made a drastic decision to forgive – which was tough – especially when one of the parties concerned continued to hate me. However, when the result of the scan showed 'something' – it was not clear what – part of me said, as I had done a few times since April, "I am not worried – I don't even care if I die."

I had various other scans and investigations in Zimbabwe and South Africa and it was ascertained that it was a non-malignant meningioma or tumour, rather than an aneurism, but that its growth would need to be monitored. If it grew too much, it would put more pressure on my brain and cause serious complications.

In September 2010 the Lord faithfully spoke to me again, this time through Dr Michelle Strydom (who teaches that 'No disease is incurable' and 'Healing begins with the sanctification of the heart'), she, together with her co-worker, Tammy van Rensburg, prayed with me and challenged me to look at the other areas of relationship breakdown in my life – all of which (relationship breakdown with others, with God and with self) contribute to the stress that causes most illnesses in the world. I had forgiven others, but what about my relationship with the Lord and with myself? When Tammy said that maybe I need to "forgive the Lord", it hit home that I did have hardness of heart toward the Lord and that I did not now fully trust Him. (If you had read my testimony in the August link, you may be saying – how is this possible when she had been so convinced how

good God is?!) I had often thought, “Where were you, Lord, when these things happened that caused me so much excruciating pain?” The Lord helped me to see that it grieved Him that I viewed Him with suspicion, when His thoughts towards me were **only** of love. I should have, at this stage, remembered from five years earlier how **good** God is!!

Next, I had a further shocking revelation. And this, having thought that I had dealt with all that was necessary – relationship breakdown with others and with God! I had been walking with the Lord for forty years, and a long time previously he had shown me how important it was to realise that I am fearfully and wonderfully made, and to love how the Lord had made me. But as I mentioned earlier, I had often felt during this season of trauma that I didn’t care if I died. The revelation I had was an offshoot of this when one morning I woke up actually thinking, “I hate myself”! The light dawned that I owned thoughts that were from the pit of hell. I told Roy and repented, then together, after my very emotional day, we broke that stronghold.

So, when we went to Johannesburg to have gamma knife surgery in December 2010, I expected that the meningioma would have disappeared. I had repented in the areas the Lord had shown me and had received much prayer for healing. It was a bit of a shock to discover that, not only had it not disappeared, but also it was now too big and too near my optic nerve to deal with by gamma knife. I was advised to have it surgically removed within the next three months.

I would have had it done then and there in South Africa, but the costs were exorbitant. So, we knew we would have to explore other avenues. Before we left Johannesburg, we were ministered to by a couple who are involved in a healing ministry. As had many others, they commanded the meningioma to go, and I was able to voice the concern that had been niggling at me for some time: “Am I acting in unbelief if I pursue having surgery?” Their answer gave me so much peace: They said, “That meningioma **is going**, even if it has to be cut out!”

To cut a long story short, we tried pursuing a couple of options, but it quickly became clear that the only viable one was a hospital chain in India (called Wockhardt Hospitals), and specifically Goa, for neurosurgery. It was a third of the price quoted in South Africa and

there were no hidden costs - **everything** was included - even for Roy to stay with me in the hospital. There were many amazing things that the Lord did which I won't go into, but the main confirmation of the Lord's Will that we should go to India came through an unsolicited gift of half the costs, the day after we prayed that He would show us definitely if we were to go. Every other provision fell into place for our trip.

So, very early on Saturday 5th March 2011 we landed in Mumbai, caught the plane at mid-day to Goa and were welcomed into Wockhardt hospital by early afternoon. Roy had a one-hour hair-raising ambulance ride with me to have an urgent MRI scan, so that the neurosurgeon could plan the operation. Roy, in sitting position in the back of the ambulance, could see the crazy traffic that we were racing and weaving through, with the ambulance's siren blaring, while I lay nonchalantly on the stretcher in my hospital-issue pyjamas, feeling that this was all just a big adventure.

Sunday came, and the sense of adventure left. I learned that I would definitely have to have the operation, and Dr Koshy George, the neurosurgeon, was "not looking forward to it"! The meningioma was deep and very vascular and he had asked another neurosurgeon from another state to assist him, even though he himself was exceptionally experienced, having performed over 7000 neurosurgeries. I had to undergo many different procedures (scans, blood tests etc.) to be ready for the surgery, which was to take place the next morning, Monday, at 07:00. On top of it, after some deliberation, it was decided that I needed to have my head completely shaved. I had not even considered the fact that neurosurgery would at least require partial, let alone complete, baldness!

The surgery took seven hours, which Dr Koshy, when he excitedly called Roy from our private ward to see me in ICU, said was pretty quick! He was also delighted at how the tumour had "behaved so beautifully" coming out easily, bit by bit – they were working through a small fissure in my brain to get to it. He said "It is very obvious that people were praying!" Up to this point I did not even know that Dr Koshy was a Christian! I knew that his wife had a relationship with the Lord, because of what she had shared when she had come to meet us the day before about her burden to intercede for Dr Koshy's

patients. But when I heard him talking boldly about the Lord Jesus to other hospital staff, I knew that the Lord had blessed us with a Christian doctor – in India! He even told me that he knew he should get help from another neurosurgeon because of the Gospel’s account of Simon of Cyrene’s being called upon to help Jesus to carry His cross.

I was some sight in the ICU – a very swollen eye, oxygen, monitors, pipes in and out, bandaged and hairless! But I could tell I was fine – all my faculties intact – including my sight! That was the afternoon of the 7th March. Two days later on the 9th, the Lord met with me.

- He said that, contrary to my fears, I would have a **wonderful** testimony! He **would** get the glory. I had the overwhelming assurance that “it was indeed all about **him**”.
- The bare bones of a scripture came to mind – After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up – and this spoke to my heart that I would be coming out of ICU on the third day. My progress was indeed miraculous and the hospital staff said it was a record for someone to be able to leave ICU after surgery like that in so short a time, because I **did** go back to our private ward the next day, the tenth! I later found the context of that scripture in Hosea 6:1&2 "Come, let us return to the **Lord**; for he has torn us, that he may heal us; he has struck us down, and he will bind us up. After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, that we may live before him." I **had** been struck down so that He could heal me! That growth represented unforgiveness, resentment towards the Lord and self-hatred – and it was **gone**!
- And then a third thing happened – I felt the **joy** of the Lord, such as I had not known for years! I was not at all concerned about my appearance, or the bruising as it showed up all over. I joked that I had come to Goa for a fancy haircut and to participate in a Beauty Pageant!

We had a wonderful time in the hospital! I loved the staff, doctors, nurses and housekeepers (all of whom, incidentally, were extremely compassionate and efficient). I had my thirty-three stitches (staples) taken out ten days after the operation and four days later was discharged. I did not even need to go back for a check-up before we

left Goa to fly home on 31st March. In the meantime, the Lord opened doors for us to meet and stay with wonderful Christian believers during the last ten days we still had in Goa.

I went for my follow up MRI scan on 13th February 2012 and that showed my head to be **completely** normal. There was no hint of tumour regrowth – typically, they tend to regrow. Dr Michelle Strydom says that this is ever a possibility for meningiomas when their spiritual roots of hatred of self (yes and this was the hardest thing for me to recognize!), are not dealt with. (I believe that the renewal of the mind I was walking through, highlighted in her teaching, removed most of these roots even before the surgery.) Plus, there was no sign of scarring from the neurosurgery. I now know why I had successfully (though very cautiously) already been able to wean myself from anti-convulsion tablets – according to the nudge I believe I had from the Lord – despite the fact that I had been firmly instructed to take them for at least two years!

May you, too, be challenged with these words:

(Hosea 6:1 ESV) “Come, let us return to the **Lord**; for he has torn us, that he may heal us; he has struck us down, and he will bind us up.

(Hosea 6:2 ESV) After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, that we may live before him.

(Hosea 6:3 ESV) **Let us know; let us press on to know the Lord; his going out is sure as the dawn; he will come to us as the showers, as the spring rains that water the earth.”**

Have you ever considered that this Scripture, obviously referring to Jesus' death and His resurrection, also clearly pertains to the Jewish people after the Holocaust? In 1945 after the Holocaust, they had been devastatingly ‘struck down’ and left as if dead? But a remnant of devastated survivors managed to stagger, against enormous odds, back to Israel – the only land they could call their own, the land promised to them by the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob – His Land, which He instructed them to steward. After two days (two years) many had regrouped in His Land, which was being ‘revived’, and on the third day (three years later in 1948), the nation of Israel was ‘raised up’ - her rebirth!

Two years after Taliban takeover, football is helping restore the happiness of 40 Afghan girls

This week marks two years since the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan. Thousands have since fled the country, with many settling in a country neighbouring Afghanistan where an idea by Open Doors local partners is bringing joy to a group of young Afghani girls...

Five times a week, 40 girls gather to play football – and it makes them so happy.

It may sound like your typical football club, but this particular initiative is anything but that, making the girls' joy all the more precious and remarkable.

Conquering fear through football

The Taliban's takeover of Afghanistan two years ago rocked the country and dealt a devastating blow to the lives and freedoms of countless Afghans, including women and girls, as well as religious minorities like Christians. For believers, following Jesus already came with great danger, but the Taliban's takeover put them at even greater risk, forcing them from the country or deeper underground.

In the months that followed, Christians were among thousands to flee the country, with many relocating to a country neighbouring Afghanistan. But for many, it led to more challenges. "The situation for them is very difficult," says Brother Ismael*. "In our region, governments do not officially recognise the presence of such a large

number of refugees and don't provide the necessary social support to them.”

It's here that Open Doors local partners have been able to help – not only with practical aid including food, clothing, medical care, blankets and hygiene items, but the provision of football. The impact on the 40 girls – plus around 100 boys – has been transformative, particularly given the desperation many of them had been feeling.

“The shocking reality is that three out of every ten of these refugee children say they want to end their lives because they spend most of their time indoors out of fear,” continues Brother Ishmael.

The initiative is open to Christians as well as Muslims and those of other faiths and none, providing a gateway to build relationships with parents. This in turn has led to the provision of practical aid and opportunities to share the gospel – and already people have come to know Jesus! A house group of 15 - 20 people has already been formed from the football initiative.

And with the Women's World Cup well underway, drawing widespread attention and excitement, the girls' happiness at being involved has likely increased!

Hope inspired by happiness

The Taliban's takeover has had a seismic impact upon the lives of countless Afghans. The stories that we share, and those that hit the news, only scratch the surface at what the group's rule means for people and their futures.

But the happiness of these 40 girls is a reminder that hope can still be found amid the pain, upheaval and loss, and it's just one of the many ways in which your prayers and support are contributing to the amazing things God is doing among Afghan refugees. Thank you, and please keep your Afghani family in your prayers.

- Afghanistan is number 9 in the Open Doors World Watch List 2023 and despite dropping from first place to ninth, Afghan Christians remain in grave danger
- There are just thousands Christians in Afghanistan – out of a population of almost 41 million.
- Main threats: Islamic oppression and dictatorial paranoia
- Given that many Christians have been forced deeper underground and must keep their faith hidden, it's difficult to get an exact idea of how many believers live in the country, but it is estimated to be in the thousands.
- “The Taliban are conducting a door-to-door search to find us. God alone knows who has informed them about the whereabouts and identities of the believers. If they find us, they kill believers on the spot.” - A secret believer from Afghanistan.
- “It is our great desire to join with our brothers and sisters and worship God together, but now this is not possible,” says the secret believer. “We can only meet our pastor in the dead of night, so no one can identify him or us.”
- Although conversions usually happen as a family unit in Afghanistan, if a woman decides to convert to Christianity on her own, discovery can bring violence, house arrest, forced marriage or sexual abuse. Women and girls already suffer acute oppression and discrimination under the Taliban. Following Jesus can severely exacerbate this.
- Please keep praying for your brothers and sisters in Afghanistan. Your prayers make an enormous difference to those following Jesus no matter the cost.

Exciting Times

When Eileen became our Open the Book prayer partner, she said she wished we were going into Haylands School, because her grandchildren go there. Some months later, the deputy head of Dover Park, which already had OtB, heard she had been appointed Head Teacher of Haylands. One of her first actions was to go to the office staff at Dover Park and ask how to contact us. Eileen was delighted when we began taking the Word of God to Haylands every week. One Thursday afternoon, she called at her daughter's house. Eileen's granddaughter ran out excitedly to meet her saying, "I was a disciple in Open the Book today!"



Beryl (*in the centre of the photo on the previous page*) is one of the storytellers serving Haylands. She has some neighbours whom she does not actually know well. However, over the past two years, Beryl had been smiling at them in the street and this had progressed to passing the time of day. One day Beryl was out shopping when she saw the mother with one of her daughters.

At our next rehearsal, Beryl excitedly told us: “It struck me that I could share about Open the Book with her, as her daughter attends Haylands school. The little girl didn’t seem to know me - as I’m dressed up when she would see me at school, I wasn’t worried about that! But when I explained to her Mum that we tell a Bible story, her daughter’s face lit up and she said: ‘I love Bible stories!’

I wondered if they had any Church connection. The mum said that she herself wasn’t ‘religious’ but that her daughter was definitely spiritual.

The child said she had a book of Bible stories and that was what she loved reading.

So I said I was so happy to hear that she loved reading Bible stories.”

“The girl then said she wanted to be a Christian and that was what was even more surprising - I want to know how she would have the knowledge to use that phrase There is no doubt I will see this family again from time to time, so I will be ready to be proactive to continue a conversation as possible. I will look out for opportunities to invite them to my church, especially to children’s activities.”

Another person who could barely contain her excitement, works at one of the schools served by Open the Book. As soon as the first storytellers arrived, she blurted out something which we, frustratingly, cannot fully disclose. Here is the redacted version!

A child in the school said to a member of staff that something was going to happen the following day. This thing was very special to the child, and the staff member asked the child how the child knew this. ‘Because I prayed about it last night,’ replied the child. The person told other staff members about this, and everyone was astonished. The staff had arranged for this thing to happen the next day, but

nobody had told any of the children.



The person who told us about this is not a committed Christian, but she kept saying that the child's family had nothing to do with religion and she was certain that the only way the child could have known about praying was through Open the Book.

On Saturday August 19th, 16 people gathered at SURC for training. Half of these were completely new to Open the Book. Here they are (in the photo on the next page) presenting Jesus calling His disciples and Jonah about to be swallowed by a rather small fish

As a result, a team to serve St Francis was formed. We are still praying for more to serve St Blasius, finally taking the Word of God to the South of the Island!
