View From Number 10 A Missional Moment

The above was the title/theme of the recent meeting of the Evangelical Alliance Council at High Leigh in Hertfordshire which was a truly uplifting and encouraging gathering to be part of. I have been privileged to serve on this group for about 9 years, supporting this wider Gospel work across Britain.

Many of you will have picked up news of the "quiet revival" identified in a survey published by The Bible Society earlier this year. This has been questioned in the media, but people shared from across the four nations of the UK that the tide really has changed and there is now a much greater openness to the Gospel. We are in a missional moment!



The keynote speaker was Justin Brierley who for many years hosted the Premier Radio "Unbelievable" debates engaging with thinkers with opposing views on Christian faith. He is married to my colleague Rev Lucy Brierley who leads the thriving URC congregation in Woking. He had noticed a shift in the atmosphere over recent years and published a book a couple of years ago -

'The Surprising Rebirth of Belief in God: Why new atheism grew old and secular thinkers are considering Christianity again'

A snappy title, don't you think?

What he saw happening among many of the great thinkers seems to have now spilled over into the wider community where people are seeking after some real answers to life's questions which the "new atheism" of Richard Dawkins and co was not delivering. Justin set the tone for the rest of the meeting as we went on exploring how we might seize the moment and help those seeking the Lord to find a home in the church. It was all so inspiring and heartening. I shared about this with the Wight Church Team and we all want to pray this into being on the Island.

Gavin Calver and Phil Knox (who spoke at Shanklin last year)



launched a new book at the meeting - Good News People. This looks at what it means to be an evangelical (good news person!) in the UK, with stories from up and down the land about faith coming alive today. The title has different overtones across the pond! It was written before the recent shift in the tide and looks like a really great read.



These seem to be exciting times to be a Christian in Britain – but it was also noted that we must challenge the way that some have used Christianity to back the new surge of nationalism that has hit the headlines. Many Christian symbols and Bible texts were evident at the recent rally organised by Tommy Robinson, but this movement seems so far removed from Gospel values. I'm sure many of you have read various critiques of it and we should be concerned that this does not tarnish the reputation of true believers who follow the sacrificial way of Christ and his generous love.

In my talk on Invitation and Welcome on 21st September I asked how we might seize the moment and become more courageous in reaching out to friends and neighbours and inviting them to explore the faith. Twenty of us recently spent a Saturday together at Ryde exploring how we might move forward positively as a church and see kingdom growth in our church life and community. The Elders will be meeting for a day retreat (or advance?) on 25th October to seek the Lord and take things forward. We can all join in praying further on 7th - 8th November when we hold another Sabbath of Prayer.

Let's grow closer to Jesus and in relationship to one another as we explore what God wants for us in this new missional moment...

A Message for September 2025

28 August 2025

Dear friends,

September has always felt more like the true beginning of the year to me than January ever does. In church life we walk our way through the life of Jesus from Advent to Pentecost, and now we begin the cycle again by turning to creation. Scripture begins with God's delight in creation: "God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good" (Genesis 1:31). The earth is not ours to use up, but God's gift in which we share, entrusted to our care as part of creation. When the land suffers, as it has this summer, we are reminded of Paul's words: "The whole creation has been groaning in labour pains until now" (Romans 8:22). This Season of Creation is a time for us to join our prayers with creation's groaning, and to renew our calling, as fellow creatures, to "serve and keep" the earth (Genesis 2:15), caring for the web of life of which we are a part.

September is also the beginning of the academic year. When we learn, teach, and seek understanding we are honouring God. Jesus himself was called "Teacher", and now is a good time to give thanks for all who teach, guide, and encourage the young. Even if your church has no young people, this is still a good time to pray for students and staff.

This year, in particular, we are living through a time of heightened tension about immigration. Again and again, Scripture calls God's people to remember their own history: "You shall love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt" (Deuteronomy 10:19). "When a foreigner resides among you in your land, do not mistreat them. The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. I am the Lord your God" (Leviticus 19:33–34). Abraham and Sarah set out in faith towards a new home (Genesis 12:1), Israel knew exile and return, and Jesus himself was once a refugee in Egypt (Matthew 2:14–15). The church is most truly the church when it embodies this welcome. I especially want to reassure all Ministers, Elders, and members who have come to the UK from around the world that you are not only welcome among us, but that we treasure the insights and experiences you bring to enrich us.

In all these things we hold fast to the unshakable promise: "Nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:39).

With my thanks for all that you do for God's work through the United Reformed Church, and with prayers for every local church and minister,

Understanding Who You Are

Over the last couple of months, we have looked at both the Law and the Will of God. Neil Anderson explains that in exercising God's Will, it is vital that we know who we are, and this is what he has to say ...

"For all who are being led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God." Romans 8:14

I enjoy asking people, "Who are you?" It sounds like a simple question requiring a simple answer, but it really isn't. For example, if someone asked me, "Who are you?" I might answer, "Neil Anderson".

"No, that's your name. Who are you?"

"I'm an American".

"No, that's where you live".

I could also say that I'm five feet nine inches tall (1.75 metres) and a little over 150 pounds (68 kg) - actually quite a little over 150 pounds (68 kg)! But my physical dimensions and appearance aren't me either. If you chopped off my arms and legs, would I still be me? If you transplanted my heart, kidneys or liver, would I still be me? Of course! Now, if you keep chopping, you'll get to me eventually because I'm in here somewhere. But who I am is far more than what you see on the outside.

"So, from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer." 2 Corinthians 5:16

We may say with the apostle Paul that we, "recognise no man according to the flesh". But we tend to identify each other and ourselves primarily by physical appearance (tall, short, stocky,

slender) or by what we do (plumber, carpenter, nurse, engineer, clerk). Furthermore, when asked to identify ourselves in relation to our faith, we usually talk about our doctrinal position (Protestant, Evangelical, Calvinist, Charismatic), our denominational preference (Baptist, Presbyterian, Methodist, Independent), or our role in the church (Sunday school teacher, choir member, deacon, usher).

But is who you are determined by what you do, or is what you do determined by who you are? That's an important question, especially as it relates to Christian maturity. I subscribe to the latter. I believe wholeheartedly that your hope for growth, meaning and fulfilment as a Christian is based on understanding who you are - specifically your identity in Christ as a child of God. Your understanding of who you are in Christ will greatly determine how you live your life.

Lord Jesus, I know I am complete in You. Don't allow me to fall back into fleshly attributes today in an attempt to impress others or You...

Neil's Freedom In Christ course majors on **Who We Are in Him** and suggests three phrases which we need to take to heart:

I am Accepted:

"Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God – children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God." (John 1:12/13)

"So you also are complete through your union with Christ, who is the head over every ruler and authority." (Colossians 2:10)

I am Significant:

"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit – fruit that will last – and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you." (John 15:16)

"I can do all this through him who gives me

strength." (Philippians 4:13)

I am Secure:

"Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death." (Romans 8:1-2)

"We know that anyone born of God does not continue to sin; the One who was born of God keeps them safe, and the evil one cannot harm them." (1 John 5:18)

Neil explores this in more detail in the article printed in the October 2024 Link, which can still be found on our website.

Those who attended the two "Freedom" courses earlier this year were given a pamphlet from Rose Publishing which explores the topic... I have some of these left and will put them out in the church in October. Please do take a copy for your family, if you haven't had one before.

Back in April, a Bible Society report showed that more people in Britain are regularly attending church and reading the Bible. Dr Rob Barward-Symmons, co-author of The Quiet Revival, speaks about the aftermath of the report's release.

'It's been amazing to see how it's continued to spread across the Christian space,' says Rob, who worked alongside Dr Rhiannon McAleer on the report.

Since the report was released, Rob and Rhiannon have been interviewed for podcasts, webinars, TV programmes and newspapers for global audiences. 'Where lots of coverage of Christianity is still quite negative, this has provided an opportunity for people to write about the appeal of church and the Bible in the mainstream space where they haven't had the opportunity in a while,' Rob says.

However, in spite of this, God is drawing many to Himself out of the nations and this includes many from nations where believers have to remain hidden. <u>Jesus said</u>, "I will build my church and the gates of hell will not prevail against it," — may we pray for those for whom following Jesus can even cost their lives, but all the time praying that in the freedoms we have <u>we will let our lights shine for Jesus</u>.

Prayer Alert: Russian pastor imprisoned for criticising war

Moscow pastor Nikolai Romanyuk has been sentenced to four years' imprisonment in a labour camp for expressing his opposition to the war in Ukraine.

The 63-year-old church leader was arrested last October after speaking out against the war.

The Balashikha City Court further imposed a three-year ban on Romanyuk administering websites.

He intends to appeal to the Moscow Regional Court, but his daughter commented, 'We all understand perfectly well that there will be no fundamental changes.'

Nigerian Christians need your help after deadly attacks

More than 200 Christians were killed and thousands displaced after attacks by radical Islamist militants in Benue State, Nigeria. Now they need your help for survival.

Radical Islamist militants attacked Christians in June in a wave of brutal assaults. For those mourning and fearful, the ordeal was only just beginning.

Now, months later, many thousands have lost their homes and are displaced. They face life-threatening scarcity of food, medicine and shelter. They urgently need your help.

"They killed many of our people"

"They invaded our village at night, around 10pm," says Imma*, one of the survivors. "They killed many of our people, including many of my husband's family."

"After the attack, they burned down buildings, including stores where mothers and children were sleeping," adds Simon*, another survivor from Benue.

The community were warned of the attacks, but they couldn't escape. The militants burned down the food stores where some of the villagers were sleeping, because their homes had been destroyed in previous attacks.

Not enough food

Believers are living in temporary, makeshift accommodation in an international market. They have lost everything.

"Because all of our food supplies have been burned, we don't have any food to eat," says Imma. "Since we arrived here, not all of us found a place to sleep. And there's not enough food. I pray that God empowers fellow believers to help us."

"The situation is really not good – people are still hungry," says Virtue*, a local Open Doors partner supporting Christians displaced by these assaults. "When you interview anybody, they tell you their main problem is hunger."

Equipping Open Doors partners

Support for Open Doors' ongoing Arise Africa campaign means our local partners have been able to help a few hundred believers already. But the scale of the emergency is huge, and more funding is needed, fast.

Open Doors partners have identified 9,000 people who have lost everything and are in critical need of assistance.

Simon puts it plainly: "To anyone who can help us, please support us who are displaced by extremists."

And do keep praying for our Nigerian brothers and sisters. Your prayers are crucial as they combat the terrible aftermath of these vicious attacks.

Isle of Wight Street Pastors

Street Pastors are trained Christian volunteers from Island churches who provide a practical, caring, and non-judgemental presence on the streets at night and at events, to help people in need and improve community safety.



Street Pastors serve as 'the church in action', offering tangible assistance like flip-flops, water, or help to get home, and a listening ear or prayer, with the goal of sharing God's love through their actions and providing a positive influence.

Street Pastors show the love that Jesus has for everyone with a non-threatening uniformed presence.

We regularly attend Island events such the IoW Festival, Cowes Week, Scooter Rally and some carnivals

We also run a Safe Space in Newport Bus Station on Friday and Saturday nights and this has already reduced the crime rates around the bus station on the nights it is open.

Isle of Wight Street Pastors are currently recruiting for more volunteers to enable us to continue growing in our ministry.

We are being asked to increase our patrols not only in Newport and Ryde but to also start patrolling in other towns on the Island and at more events and to also increase the nights that our Safe Space is open in Newport Bus Station, but this can only be done if we have more volunteers.

Requirements: -

- Be at least 18 years old, with no upper limit (our oldest currently is in their 70s)
- Be a committed Christian who has been attending a local church for at least a year
- Provide good references and pass a DBS check
- All abilities welcome (has been known for volunteers to patrol on mobility scooters and we have the safe space you can do if your mobility is not great)
- Care about their community.

Able to offer at least one night a month, more is welcome.


